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AIRPORT

CANCUN INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Cancún International Airport is located approximately 25 minutes from the Hotel Zone and 20 minutes from downtown Cancun. It is the second busiest airport in Mexico, receiving the largest number of international passengers in the country.

IMMIGRATION PROCESS

There's 2 ways to go around this: the traditional immigration line, and the new electronic passport control machines (available only in T3 and T4). If you choose to do the latter, follow these steps:

- 1.Scan your passport
- 2. Wait for your photo to be taken
- 3. Collect your receipt with the QR code
- 4. Retain this receipt as you may be asked for it upon departure

*Please note that you do not need to fill out anything online regarding the QR code receipt before your departure. Simply keep it safe until you leave Mexico.

EXITING THE AIRPORT

After clearing customs, you'll enter the arrivals hall, where you'll be approached by various vendors offering different services. If you have pre-arranged transportation, walk swiftly past these vendors and exit the airport building. The official transfer services will be located outside the airport.

Avoid the vendors trying to engage you before exiting the terminal, as they may attempt to sell you timeshare or other unwanted services.

VISITAX: A MANDATORY TAX

All international travelers to Cancun must pay this tax, contrary to any online claims of avoiding it. You can pay the tax prior to arrival in Mexico or during your stay. This is the only official website to **pay Visitax**. Be aware of any other websites claiming to collect this tax, as they are likely scams and may charge higher fees. TRANSPORTATION FROM THE AIRPORT

Pickup and drop-off areas are located right outside the Arrival and Departure terminals. Inside the airport you will find different transportation services such as luxury vehicles, taxis, buses and car rental companies.

We recommend booking airport transfers in advance through a reputable company like **Cancun Shuttle**, **Traslados Cancun**, or **eTransfers** for a hassle-free arrival and departure.

TRANSPORTATION

BY BUS

There are different urban bus routes that run through the city and the hotel zone. The <u>Route 1</u>, runs along the Hotels Zone and also takes you to downtown, Tulum Ave, bus station and Puerto Juarez. You don't have to wait more than 3-4 minutes for the bus, and the cost is approximately \$ 12 pesos.

BY TAXI

Catching a taxi in Cancun is very simple, as they are readily available in areas frequented by tourists. However, be cautious of common scams that are prevalent in the city. A notorious one is the "tourist price," where taxi drivers illegally charge inflated fares to visitors. If a driver attempts this practice or claims their meter is broken, politely refuse their services and find another taxi.

Taxis waiting in the Hotel Zone are generally safer and more reliable than those hailed in downtown areas. If you find yourself outside the Hotel Zone, it is advisable to call a reputable, local taxi company, and arrange for them to pick you up. This is one we could recommend: +52 (998) 148 9592

BY UBER

While Uber operates in Cancun, it hasn't always been straightforward due to issues with local taxi companies. However, in November 2023, a landmark agreement was reached, allowing local taxi drivers to operate within the app, making it a safer and more viable option for travelers.

Tips for Using Uber in Cancun:

- Choose Discretion: Wait until you're out of sight of taxi ranks or stands before ordering an Uber to avoid potential conflicts with taxi drivers.
- Opt for the Front Seat: Consider sitting in the front seat to make it appear like
- you're getting a ride from a friend, rather than an Uber driver.
- Handling Approaches: If approached by taxi drivers while waiting for an Uber, you can politely say "esperando a un amigo" (waiting for a friend) or mention that the driver works for your hotel.

BY CAR

You will find in Cancun all the major car rental companies. They all have a great range of new and comfortable rental cars. This is the easiest way to explore the surrounding beaches, villages and Mayan Ruins.

BY FERRY

For traveling to Isla Mujeres you will need to take a ferry.

There are four different docks in Cancun: **Playa Tortugas**, **Playa Caracol** and **El Embarcadero** (all located within the hotel zone), and one in **Puerto Juárez**. There are departures every half hour and just a 15 minute ferry ride to this beautiful

island.
